### **5 February 2016 – International Conference “News organizations standing up for the safety of media professionals”, UNESCO Headquarters, Paris**

Organized under the auspices of the International Programme for the Development of Communication (IPDC), the Conference aims to provide news organizations with a platform to discuss existing and new measures aimed to strengthen journalists’ safety worldwide and engage with Member States on these issues.

### **15 February 2016 - Nominations for UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize 2016**

UNESCO invites the governments of Member States, in consultation with their National Commissions, as well as international and regional professional and non-governmental organizations active in the fields of journalism and freedom of expression to nominate candidates for this year’s UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize. Nominations for the Prize should be submitted by filling out the [form](#) in English or French and sending it before 15 February 2016.

This Prize was established in 1997 in honour of Guillermo Cano, a Colombian journalist who died in the exercise of his profession. Its purpose is to reward each year a person, organization or institution that has made a notable contribution to the defense and/or promotion of press freedom anywhere in the world, especially if risks have been involved.

### **21 February 2016 – International Mother Language Day**

In line with Sustainable Development Goal 4 on education of the Agenda 2030, and the Education 2030 Framework for Action, the theme of Mother Language Day (IMLD) 2016 is “Quality education, language(s) of instruction and learning outcomes”.

On the occasion of the Day, UNESCO reiterates its position on the importance of appropriate languages of instruction, usually mother tongues, in early years of schooling: formal and non-formal education must deliver quality education for all learners by taking a multilingual approach.

### **8 March 2016 – International Women’s Day**

The official UN system’s theme for this Day in 2016 is “Planet 50-50 by 2030: Step It Up for Gender Equality”.

Events organized at UNESCO Headquarters on this occasion will include a Round Table on “Violent Extremism and Radicalization: Women as Perpetrators, Victims and Agents of Change” on 8 March, and a panel discussion on “Critical Global Conversation on Gender Equality and the Law”, organized on 10 March in cooperation with the University of Pennsylvania Law School (PennLaw). An exhibition on “Women’s Role in Sustainable Development” will be on display from 7 to 18 March 2016, with the opening ceremony to be held on Monday 7 March or Tuesday 8 March 2016.

Celebrated for over 100 years and proclaimed by the United Nations in 1977, International Women’s Day is an opportunity to reflect on progress made, to call for change and to celebrate acts of courage and determination by ordinary women who have played an extraordinary role in the history of their countries and communities.

### **7-11 March 2016 - Mobile Learning Week 2016 (MLW 2016), UNESCO Headquarters, Paris, France**

Mobile Learning Week 2016 will shed light on the ways technology can be leveraged — in different contexts and for different groups — to improve the quality of education now and in the future. It will explore how mobile technology can help fill the education gap. The event will advance international understandings about the ways in which newly affordable information and communication technologies can prompt innovation within the education sector to better ensure high-quality learning opportunities for all, in line with the new Sustainable Development Agenda and 2030 targets for education.

The theme of Mobile Learning Week is “Innovating for quality”. The event has four core tracks: the WEBINAR, which will allow online participants to debate; a series of knowledge-building workshops; a symposium and a policy forum, when participants will join high-level government representatives to understand how policies and cross-sectoral collaboration between ministries of education and ministries of technology can foster innovation to improve the quality, equity and accessibility of education.

### **UNESCO Participation Programme for 2016-2017**

As you know, the UNESCO Participation Programme provides support to activities that are related to UNESCO’s mandate and fields of competence. This Programme is intended for Member States, but also in a limited way to NGOs in official partnership with UNESCO, who may submit up to two requests under this Programme for projects with sub-regional, regional or interregional impact, provided that their request is definitely supported by at least the Member State where the project is to be implemented and another Member State concerned by the request.

For 2016-2017, projects presented should relate to the two global priorities of the Organization - Africa and Gender Equality - as well as to UNESCO’s Major Programmes and interdisciplinary projects in favour of Least Developed Countries (LDCs), developing countries, Post-Conflict and Post-Disaster Countries (PCPD), Small Island Developing States (SIDS) and Countries In Transition (CITs). Project selection will be done taking into account the defined priorities by the governing bodies for the regular programme of UNESCO (please refer to the [Director-General’s Circular Letter](#) of 11 December 2015). It should be underlined that, taking into account the restricted budget earmarked to the Participation Programme for 2016-2017 and in order to be in a position to respond favorably to a higher number of requests, the amounts which will be approved during this biennium should not exceed US\$16 000.

The deadline set for the submission of requests by [NGOs in official partnership with UNESCO](#) is 31 August 2016, and first approvals will not be granted before October 2016.
